Report on the Lecture on "Binary Accreditation"

The keynote speaker, **Prof. Anjana Sharma**delivered an insightful address on Binary Accreditationon 13th December 2024 at IQAC conference Hall

Key Highlightsare as follows:

- 1. Prof. Sharma introduced the 'Yes/No' accreditation framework for simplicity and clarity. She emphasized its qualitative approach compared to traditional grading systems and referred participants to the NAAC guidelines.
- She comprehensively explained that the Binary Accreditation system ensures transparent and uniform evaluation criteria for essential quality benchmarks. Emphasis areas include student outcomes, teachinglearning processes, governance, and infrastructure.
- 3. Prof. Sharma outlined steps for transitioning to Binary Accreditation, stressing robust documentation, self-assessment, and compliance with NAAC standards.

- 4. She also discussed the challenges and opportunities in the new accreditation system: Challenges: Resistance to change, capacity building, and enabling smaller institutions to meet criteria. Opportunities: Simplifying decision-making for stakeholders and fostering a quality-driven culture.
- 5. She informed that Institutions will be categorized as Accredited: CGPA > 2.00, Provisionally Accredited: 1.50 ≤ CGPA < 2.00, and Not Accredited: CGPA < 1.50. The seven criteria of NAAC will continue to guide assessments:

Key Concepts of MBGL:

- Shift from Pass-Fail: MBGL moves beyond simple pass-fail assessments to provide a nuanced evaluation of
 institutional maturity.
- Holistic Evaluation: Considers various aspects of an institution, not just academic performance.
- Continuous Improvement: Focuses on an institution's journey of growth and consistent efforts for development.
- Graded Levels: Categorizes institutions into levels based on performance and adherence to standards.
- Dynamic Assessment: Not a static ranking but a continuous evaluation tool.
- Diagnostic Tool: Helps institutions identify strengths and weaknesses for targeted improvement.

MBGL Assessment Criteria:

- Curriculum Quality: Evaluate the academic programs' relevance, rigor, and contemporary nature.
- Faculty Competence: Assesses the faculty members' qualifications, expertise, and research output.
- Research Contributions: Examines the quality and impact of the institution's research activities.
- Student Support Services: Reviews the availability and effectiveness of student support systems.
- Infrastructure: Evaluates the adequacy and quality of the institution's physical resources.
- Governance: Assesses the effectiveness of the institution's leadership and management.

Benefits of MBGL:

• For Institutions:

- o Identifies areas for focused intervention and development.
- o Promotes self-evaluation, quality assurance, and continuous improvement.
- Provides a roadmap for growth and allows for showcasing strengths.
- o Encourages a culture of quality-driven education.

For Students:

- Offers transparency in understanding the quality of education.
- o Empower students to make informed choices about institutions.

Overall:

- o Promotes quality and excellence in higher education.
- o Creates an ecosystem of learning, fostering innovation and academic rigor.
