ORDINANCE NO. 93

BACHELOR OF EDUCATION CORRESPONDENCE COURSE (TWO SEMESTER)

B. ED. (C.C.)

A person; who had obtained a Bachelor's Degree of this University or a Degree recognised as equivalent there to shall be eligible for admission to Bachelor of Education Correspondence Course (Two Semester) provided that he has passed High School/. Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination at least in the Second Division and has passed atleast one of the Examination in the Second Division leading to Bachelor's or - Master's Degree.

- For admission to the Examination of Semester-I, a candidate shall apply to the Registrar of the University on a prescribed form through the Head, Department of Correspondence Gourses and produce the Certificate of having attended the prescribe contact programme of three weeks duration (To be organised in October/November) by the Department. The University Examination for Semester-I shall be conducted in the Month of April/May.
- (b) For admission to the Examination of Semester-II, a candidate shall apply to the Registrar of the University on a prescribed form through the Head, Department of Correspondence Courses and produce the following Certificates:
- (i) Certificate of having passed Semester-I Examination.
- (ii) Certificate of having attended prescribed contact programme of one week duration organised by the Department and completed Internship Programme of six weeks in a recognised school.
- (iii) Certificate of having taught 40 lessons ('20 in each subject selected by the candidate for the practice teaching under the supervision of approved supervisor by the Head, Department of Correspondence Courses.
- (iv) Having completed all the assignments.

The University Examination for the Second Semester, shall be conducted in August/September.

Division will be given on the pasis of the Examina passed in Two Semesters.

The classification of Division in Theory (Semester & Part-I of Semester-II) will be as under:

DIVISION -I 60% and above, DIVISION -II 45% or more but less than 60% DIVISION -III 33% or more but less

than 45%

Candidates securing less than 33% will not be declared successful.

NOTE: In each Theory Paper the candidate should obtain at least 25% Marks.

> The classification of Division in the Practice -Component (Second Semester Part-II) will be as under-

DIVISION-I. 80% and above. DIVISION-II 60% or more but less than 80% DIVISION-III .. 40% or more but less than 60%

Below 40% will not be declared successful.

- 4/ Internal Assessment of each candidate is to be carried out during Second Semester, and Internship Programme.
- Each Student is required to attend Internship Programme 5/ and will have to participate in all curricular and extra-curricular activities organised in the school, during the Internship Programme.

6/ The Scope of the subjects will be indicated in the Prospectus.

7/ There will be an Internal Choice in questions. Questions will be asked unit.wise

If a candidate fails in any part of the Second - Semester (i.e. Part-I and Part-II), he or she may 8/ appear at a subsequent examination in that part only.
