ORDINANCE NO.137..

MASTER OF JOURNALISM & MASS COMMUNICATION

1. The examination for the degree of Master of Journalism and Mass Communication a profession course shall consist of two parts:-
 - (a) Previous Examination, with four theory papers and,
 - (b) Final Examination, with three theory papers & one Dissertation.
2. A Candidate after taking his ~~Bachelor's degree~~ ^{B.J./BJMC Degree} of the University or an examination of any Statutory University of India or any Examination equivalent to Bachelor's ^{B.J./BJMC} degree recognized by the University shall be eligible for the admission in previous course of Master of Journalism & Mass Communication ~~preference shall be given to the students having B.J.M.C. degree.~~ The mode of admission shall be decided by the Head of the Institution imparting instructions for the Master of Journalism & Mass Communication Course.
~~A candidate with Master degree, if also, desirous to take admission in M.J.M.C. course, may be admitted for the regular course of Master of Journalism & Mass Communication.~~
3. A candidate who has completed a regular course of study for the academic year in any affiliated College or SOS of the University and has passed the previous examination in the subject shall be admitted for the Final examination of M.J.M.C. course as regular student.
4. No candidate shall be permitted to appear in this course as Non-Collegiate candidate.
5. All candidates of this course shall essentially, have to submit dissertation lieu of new paper in the Final Examination. Each student shall complete dissertation work under the supervision of a faculty assigned by the Head of the Department at the beginning of the academic year. The dissertation in two copies shall be submitted by the students through their supervisor before the commencement of Theory examination. The student shall be required to attach a certification duly countersigned by the supervisor that the dissertation is the out come of his own research/work conducted during the academic year.
6. (i) A candidate obtaining 60% or above marks shall be placed in First division.
(ii) A candidate obtaining 50% of marks and above but less than 60% shall be awarded second division.
(iii) The minimum passing marks in individual paper and in aggregate, as well, shall be 50%. There shall be no Third division.
(iv) The division shall be awarded at the end of Final Examination result taking together the marks obtained in previous and Final Examination.
(v) The merit list shall be declared by the University on the basis of two years-integrated performance of the candidate.
Provided that merit list shall include only those first Five candidates who have secured First division in single attempt only.

7. ⑥ A candidate may apply for revaluation of any two of his answer books as per the

8-7 provisions of the Ordinance relating to Examination General.

9. ⑥ The grace marks shall also be granted to candidates as per the existing rules prevalent for master's degree examination.

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
